Easy to Define Your Intention

An easy way for you to make a gift to the Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation is through a **bequest in your will**. It is a great way to support the mission you believe in.

A will is your statement about what matters most in your life. By making a will you can clearly define your intentions.



After providing for family and friends, consider a gift to Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation to continue your support and the mission you believe in. Bequest gifts can take many forms such as a specific gift amount, a specific gift type, a percentage of the estate, a percentage of the residue of an estate, or the entire residue considering all other provisions of your will. Or a bequest can be contingent, which will take effect only after other provisions cannot be satisfied. Here are a two examples:

Specific Bequest: The most popular type of bequest, you designate Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation to receive a specific dollar amount or a specific piece of property. As with any charitable bequest, the estate receives a charitable estate tax deduction for the full amount of the bequest.

Example: Jane Doe wills \$10,000 to the Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation.

Sample language: "I give to the Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation, a Florida not-for-profit corporation, federal tax ID Number 65-0221660, located in Bradenton, Florida the sum of \$10,000 for its general uses and purposes.

Percentage Bequest: You give Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation a percentage of your estate.

Example: John Jones leaves 25 percent of his estate to Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation and the balance (75 percent) is divided between his son and daughter.

Sample language: "I give to Bradenton Kiwanis Foundation, a Florida not-for-profit corporation, federal tax ID Number 65-0221660, located in Bradenton, Florida twenty-five percent (25%) of my estate for its general uses and purposes with the balance divided equally between my son Sam Jones of Bradenton, Florida and my daughter Mary Thompson of Palmetto, Florida."
